Artist, curator, and historian Jane Palm-Gold will explore how Jarman found peace and purpose in his iconic garden project.







The Gay Liberation Front had offices there and the London Lesbian & Gay Switchboard also operated an information and support helpline for five hours every evening from above the shop. Housmans continues to be a home for London's LGBT community and each month hosts Housmans Queer Book Club, The Melanated Queers Reading Collective and The Queer Girls' Book Club.






