On Caledonian Road, Islington visit iconic radical bookshop Housmans. In the 1970s and 1980s Housman was a hive of LGBT activism. The Gay Liberation Front had offices there and the London Lesbian & Gay Switchboard operated above the shop. Each week the bookshop hosts *Housmans Queer Book Club*, *The Melanated Queers Reading Collective* and *The Queer Girls' Book Club*.
